COALITION INTERNATIONALE POUR LA VILLE ET LES TERRITOIRES DURABLES (CIVTED)

The signatories of the coalition join forces to pursue the same goal and to carry out common actions. They are composed of different actors, represented by entities. Each entity remains independent for its functions and projects.

The objectives of the coalition are:

- Acting collectively for developing public policies at local, regional and global levels, working for sustainable development of cities and territories.
- Promoting partnership for sustainable cities and territories between different actors at public, economique, private and civil society.
- Facilitating application of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at local and regional level.

The actions carried out by the coalition are, for exemple:

- The actions carried out by the coalition are, for example:
- Every September 25 (anniversary date of the SDGs), creation and diffusion of events in common.
- Actions focussing mainly on Africa corresponding to the goals of ICOSCAT under the slogan #AfricaInCommon.
- Communications and advocacy for SDG 11 projects and actions related to other SDGs.
- Workshops, conferences, meetings, summits, forums, at the local or global level according to the international agenda.

The entities forming the coalition are composed by different and complementary actors:

This diversity is indispensable for the transversal application of the SDGs. The entities are divided by college:

- College of NGOs, associations or collectives
- College of universities, training or research centers
- College of professional institutions or associations
- College of large or small companies
- College of Local Authorities

The coalition is coordinated and animated by the NGO Urbanistes Sans Frontières (USF)

Within the coalition, bilateral or multilateral, temporary or permanent partnerships can be established for the implementation of coalition goals. In this sense, this coalition can bring together a multitude of partnerships for the sustainable cities and territories.

The signatories undertake to respect the values and goals of the coalition and to avoid any contradiction between their independent projects and the actions of ICOSCAT.

In fact, the signatory members of the coalition will benefit from local and international visibility. This visibility will require a great vigilance on the positioning and the choice of independent or collective projects.
